October is Bullying Prevention Month, and it's the perfect time to start meaningful conversations with your child about digital safety, kindness, and online responsibility.

We've created this packet to help you support your student, both in protecting them from cyberbullying and in guiding them to be respectful digital citizens themselves.

Let's work together to create safer, more supportive online communities for our children.

Cyberbullying Prevention Parent Checklist

Use this simple checklist to take action this month:

- □ Talk about cyberbullying: what it is, how it feels, and what to do if it happens.
- ☐ Check in regularly about your child's online experiences and emotional well-being.
- Review privacy settings together on all apps and devices.
- ☐ Set clear family rules for respectful digital behavior.
- ☐ Create a safe space where your child feels comfortable reporting issues.
- ☐ Know your school's policy on cyberbullying and how to report it.
- Model positive behavior in your own digital interactions.
- Bookmark help resources, such as stopbullying.gov or local reporting tools.

How to Prevent Your Child from Becoming a Cyberbully

Be Kind Online

- Talk about empathy: help them understand how their words impact others online.
- Establish consequences for hurtful digital behavior at home.
- Monitor tone and content of your child's texts, comments, or posts.
- Correct early signs of teasing, exclusion, or sarcasm before it escalates online.
- Encourage kindness and accountability: being anonymous online is no excuse to be cruel.
- Help them think critically: Would I say this to someone's face? Would I be okay if this were said to me?

Tips to Help Keep Your Student Safe from Cyberbullying

- **1. Keep devices in shared spaces,** when possible, especially for younger children.
- Encourage open dialogue: make it clear they can come to you without fear of punishment.
- 3. **Teach them how to block/report** harmful users or messages on every platform they use.
- 4. Remind them: never share passwords, even with friends.
- **5. Be alert to signs** of distress, withdrawal, or secrecy with devices, these could signal cyberbullying.
- **6. Use parental controls** or monitoring tools to stay aware of digital activity, especially for younger kids.

Lista de verificación para padres para la prevención del acoso cibernético

Utilice esta sencilla lista de verificación para actuar este mes:

- Hable sobre el acoso cibernético: qué es, cómo se siente y qué hacer si sucede.
- Infórmese periódicamente sobre las experiencias en línea y el bienestar emocional de su hijo.
- Revise la configuración de privacidad juntos en todas las aplicaciones y dispositivos.
- ☐ **Establezca reglas familiares** claras para un comportamiento digital respetuoso.
- ☐ Cree un espacio seguro donde su hijo se sienta cómodo informando problemas.
- Conozca la política de su escuela sobre ciberacoso y cómo depunciarlo
- Modele un comportamiento positivo en sus propias interacciones digitales.
- Identifique recursos de ayuda, como stopbullying.gov o línea de ayuda locales.

Consejos para ayudar a mantener a su estudiante a salvo del ciberacoso

- Mantenga los dispositivos en espacios compartidos, cuando sea posible, especialmente para los niños más pequeños.
- 2. Fomente el diálogo abierto: deje en claro que pueden acudir a usted sin temor a ser castigados.
- Enséñeles cómo bloquear o denunciar usuarios o mensajes dañinos en cada plataforma que utilicen.
- Recuérdeles: nunca comparta contraseñas, ni siquiera con amigos.
- Esté alerta a las señales de angustia, retraimiento o secretismo con los dispositivos, ya que podrían indicar acoso cibernético.
- Utilice controles parentales o herramientas de monitoreo para estar al tanto de la actividad digital, especialmente en el caso de los niños más pequeños.

Cómo evitar que su hijo se convierta en un ciberacosador

Be Kind Online

- Hable sobre empatía: ayúdelos a comprender cómo sus palabras impactan a los demás en línea.
- Establecer consecuencias para el comportamiento digital dañino en casa.
- Supervise el tono y el contenido de los textos, comentarios o publicaciones de su hijo.
- Corrija los primeros signos de burla, exclusión o sarcasmo antes de que escale en línea.
- Fomente la amabilidad y la responsabilidad: Ser anónimo en línea no es excusa para ser cruel.
- Ayúdelos a pensar críticamente: ¿Le diría esto a alguien en la cara? ¿Estaría bien si me dijeran esto?

1. Setting up the class:
